

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF  
ROWAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
ADJOURNED SESSION  
OCTOBER 25, 1971

The Rowan County Commissioners met in an Adjourned Session in District Courtroom II, Rowan County Courthouse Salisbury, NC at 7:30 p.m. The following members were present: Chairman Eugene McCombs, J. Lewis Sowers, Charlie Walters, Richard Messinger and Rufus Honeycutt.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman and turned over to Wallace Peeler, Tax Supervisor, for the purpose of hearing proposals and the selection of a firm to conduct the revaluation of all property in the County as required by the NC General Statutes.

Mr. W. F. Hester of Associated Surveys from Greensboro presented his firm's proposal. Their price for doing the revaluation was \$250,000.

Mr. Trumble, representing Cole-Layer-Trumble out of Dayton, Ohio, presented his firm's proposal. Their price for doing the job was \$234,000.

The Commissioners then discussed the pros and cons of each firm with the Tax Supervisor. Mr. Sowers moved that the Tax Supervisor advise Cole-Layer-Trumble that the Commissioner's will accept their bid of \$234,000 based on a written contract approved by both the State Board of Assessments and the County Attorney. Mr. Messinger seconded this motion and it was unanimously passed.

Mr. Peeler then went over, with the Commissioners, the pertinent changes in the 1971 Machinery Act.

Upon a motion by Mr. Sowers, seconded by Mr. Honeycutt, the week of October 24-30, 1971 was proclaimed American Education Week in Rowan County. This was unanimously approved. A cop of the proclamation was sent to Mrs. F. A. Sowers of the Rowan County School System.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
