The Rowan County Board of Commissioners met for a Special Called meeting on 4/23/90 at 8:45 a.m. in the Conference Room of the Community Building.

The County Manager, County Finance Director, County Attorney, and Clerk to the Board were also in attendance. Vice-Chairman Swaim presided.

HAZARDOUS WASTE SITE: STANLY COUNTY:

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss correspondence from Stanly County to Mr. Alvis Turner, Chairman of the N. C. Hazardous Waste Management Commission, regarding the possibility of a proposed hazardous waste facility in Stanly County. County Manager Tim Russell distributed copies of the letter to Board members, as attached to these minutes.

Commissioner DeMarcus made a motion to send a letter, which she read aloud, to Mr. Turner expressing the concerns against the proposed siting in Stanly County, as attached to these minutes. Commissioner Palmer seconded, with unanimous approval.

Chairman Cohen suggested that members may want to follow-up on the letter, and attend the next meeting of the Hazardous Waste Management Commission, on 4/26/90.

EARTH DAY DONATION:

On the next order of business, Commissioner Knox made a motion to donate \$100 to offset administrative costs for the Earth Day 1990 ceremonies. Commissioner DeMarcus seconded, with unanimous approval.

ARLINGTON ST. EXTENSION REQUEST:

Mr. Glenn Ketner, Jr., Mr. Curry Krider and Mr. Dave Roberts appeared before the Board to request allowance of a right-of-way from East Innes Street to Old Concord Road, for the extension of Arlington Street. They appeared to request permission to contact the Federal Emergency Management Association to gain permission for the right-of-way. Mr. Ketner explained that this procedure is necessary at any time a right-of-way is being brought through an area of a flood plain.

Mr. Ketner explained the plans and introduced the affected areas to the Board, through maps and an aerial photograph. Property owners involved include M.F.W. Associates, Rowan County, City of Salisbury and Mr. Krider.

The Board was assured that, although the area is in a flood plain, Rowan County would assume no liability. At this time, Commissioner Knox made a motion to approve the request. Commissioner DeMarcus seconded, with unanimous approval.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
