

NOTICE

The North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice, **anticipates** the allocation of Juvenile Crime Prevention Council funds to Rowan County for programs serving delinquent and at-risk youth in the amount of **\$322,700**. These funds require a local match of 30% and will be available for the state fiscal year 2014-2015, beginning on, or after July 1, 2014.

In order to apply for FY 2014-2015 JCPC funding, you must **complete and submit your application online** by accessing NC ALLIES. Please read and follow all instructions at the following link: <https://cp.ncdjjdp.org/CP/>. After submitting the application electronically, print and submit by mail **or** hand deliver five (5) original applications to the Rowan County Manager's Office, second floor of 130 West Innes Street, Salisbury, NC 28144. Private non-profits are also required to submit No Over Due Tax forms, Conflict of Interest Statements, and proof of 501(c)(3). **The deadline for receiving completed applications is March 14, 2014 at 1:00 pm.**

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency: adjudicated or youth at risk of becoming delinquent with: peer relationship issues, associated with delinquent peers; moderate school behavioral issues; use or abuse who are in need of assessment or treatment; parents who have problems providing adequate levels of supervision; have the potential to runaway from home or placement; have prior adjudications.

Applicants being sought should be able to address the following:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Adjudicated or at risk youth who associate with other delinquent peers or who associated with or are gang members.

Individual Domain: Adjudicated or at risk youth who have some level of mental health or substance abuse needs, have a history of abuse or neglect or who engaged in dangerous sexual behaviors or have sexual offending behaviors.

Family Domain: Adjudicated or at risk youth who have parents who are in need of parent/family supervision skills, have a history of domestic conflict, have a criminal history and have family members who abuse alcohol or drugs.

School Domain: Adjudicated or at risk youth who have multiple unexcused absences, short or long term suspensions, are expelled or dropped out of school or have school disciplinary problems.

Based on the JCPC planning process conducted to date, the dispositional options needed in this County have been identified and are listed as follows:

Teen Court	Psychological Assessment	Restitution
Counseling Services	Substance Abuse Assessment /Treatment	Vocational Development
Sex Offender Treatment Services	Interpersonal Skill Building	
Community Day Programs	Parent/Family Skill Building	

Local public agencies, non-profit agencies, non-profit corporations and local housing authorities whose applications meet the funding criteria need to be prepared to make a (10) minute presentation to the JCPC Allocations Committee. Applicants will be contacted and informed of the schedule for presentations.
