Friday, February 6, 2026 at 5:00 p.m. <i>LAST DAY to register to vote or make changes to Voter Registration records</i>
Thursday, February 12, 2026 at 8:00 a.m. <i>Early Voting begins (See front cover for Early Voting Site information)</i>
Tuesday, February 17, 2026 at 5:00 p.m. <i>LAST DAY to request an Absentee Ballot</i>
Saturday, February 28, 2026 at 3:00 p.m. <i>Early Voting ends (See front cover for Early Voting Site information)</i>
Tuesday, March 3, 2026 at 7:30 p.m. <i>Absentee Ballots must arrive at the Elections Office by 7:30 p.m.</i>

Valid Photo ID Required for All Voters

All NC voters are required to show a valid photo ID when they check-in to vote. Voters who vote by mail will be asked to include a photocopy of an acceptable ID when returning their ballot by mail. All voters will be allowed to vote with or without a photo ID. If any voter is unable to show a valid photo ID when voting, they may vote with a provisional ballot.

Early Voting Same Day Voter Registration

Same Day Registration is permitted at any Early Voting Site. Voters must provide both an acceptable, valid photo ID and a proof of residence by presenting a valid document showing current name and residential address.

Voting Absentee By Mail

Any registered voter may request an absentee ballot. You may request a ballot in one of two ways: complete the **Absentee Ballot Request Form**, available in-person at our office or online at: www.RowanCountyNC.gov/Elections, or submit a request online using the **NC Absentee Ballot Portal** at VoteByMail.ncsbe.gov. Requests must be received in our office by **5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 17, 2026.**

Curbside Voting

Curbside voting is available at all Rowan County Early Voting Sites and Election Day Polling Places. To be eligible for curbside voting, you must take an oath affirming that you are unable to enter the polling place due to age or physical disability. When you come to vote, look for the designated parking space(s) marked “Curbside Voting” and a poll worker will walk to your vehicle to assist you with the voting process.

What Is a Primary Election?
A Primary Election is how political parties choose their candidates for the
General Election in November. The candidates who receive the most votes will
move on to the General Election on **Tuesday, November 3, 2026**. Not every race
or political party will have a primary election.

Who can Vote in the Primary?
Voters registered with a political party may vote only that party’s ballot.
(Republicans vote the Republican ballot and Democrats vote the Democratic
ballot.) Some parties may not have a primary ballot. **Unaffiliated voters** may
choose one ballot (Democratic, Republican, or nonpartisan, if available.)

Second Primary
In some races, a candidate must receive a required percentage of votes to win the
primary. If no candidate meets that requirement, a second primary may be held.
If held, the second primary election day will be **Tuesday, May 12, 2026 (6:30
a.m. – 7:30 p.m.)**. Not all races or political parties will have a second primary.
