The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association is proud of the students who have received these scholarships and the sheriffs who have sponsored their applications. A list of the criteria for being selected for one of these scholarships is attached.



North Carolina Sheriffs' Association Criminal Justice Scholarships

Eligibility: Ten scholarships are offered each semester to full-time North Carolina resident undergraduate students majoring in criminal justice, one for each UNC constituent institution that has a criminal justice program.

First priority in selection is given to the son or daughter of (1) a sheriff or deputy sheriff or (2) any law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty. Second priority is given to a son or daughter of any sheriff or deputy sheriff who is deceased, retired (regular or disability), or is currently active in North Carolina law enforcement. Third priority is given to any criminal justice student meeting the institution's academic and financial need criteria.

The state institutions eligible to participate in the criminal justice program are: Appalachian State University, East Carolina University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, North Carolina Central University, North Carolina State University, The University of North Carolina at Charlotte, The University of North Carolina at Pembroke, The University of North Carolina at Wilmington, and Western Carolina University.

Value: These scholarships are valued at \$1,000 each semester. A total of 20 scholarships are available per year.

Application Procedure: Recipients of the scholarship are chosen by the financial aid office at the constituent institution of the University of North Carolina which the student plans to attend or is currently attending. The student must obtain a letter of recommendation from the Sheriff of the county in North Carolina where he or she resides.

Applications are available from the school's financial aid office, and after completion, should be returned to the school's financial aid office.
